



CPA Individual License Renewal

It's time to renew your Georgia Certified Public Accountant license. Your license expires December 31, 2017, so visit https://gaboa.mylicense.com/egov/Login.aspx before then to renew. Instructions can be found below.

If this is your first time renewing your license, you will need to register as a new user and create a new login. After logging in, click on the License Renewal link to begin the renewal process, and follow the step-by-step guide through the online renewal. The process takes only a few minutes. After updating your home and email addresses, phone number(s), and answering the renewal questions, you may pay your renewal fee using your MasterCard or Visa card via our secure server. Your license renewal will not be complete until you have completed the online renewal and submitted the renewal fee. Additional documentation is required by non U.S. Citizens.



Online Renewal Instructions

- 1. Visit the Georgia Online Licensing site at https://gaboa.mylicense.com/egov/Login.aspx (Free internet access is available at Georgia public libraries.)
- 2. If this is your first time renewing your license, you will need to register as a new user and create a new login.
- 3. Click on the License Renewal link to begin the renewal process.
- 4. Update your mailing address, phone number, e-mail address and answer the renewal questions.
- 5. Pay your renewal fee(s) using your MasterCard or Visa on our secure server.
- 6. Print your receipt of payment.
- 7. Verify your renewal online the next day at www.cpaverify.org (add an additional day if the renewal was completed after 3PM).
- 8. You will receive a plastic wallet license card from NASBA within six (6) weeks after the renewal is complete.

Renewal by Paper Application

If you choose not to renew online and would like a paper renewal application, please send an email request to the Board office at gsba@sao.ga.gov. Make sure to include your CPA license number on all correspondence to the Board office. Paper renewal applications must be received in the GSBA office before 12/31/17.

Please note that renewing by mail may take up to four (4) weeks to process after the completed renewal application is received. A \$100 late fee will be imposed if you renew after the expiration date of your license.

Board of Accountancy

In 2012, the Georgia State Board of Accountancy (GSBA) along with the Georgia Society of CPAs (GSCPA) and the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA) undertook the mission to move the Board due to the lack of effective oversight. To ffectively protect the Public in Georgia, the GSBA needed to be put in a position where they could regulate and enforce the State Rules and Regulations that were currently in place. To prevent the erosion of the CPA license in the state, the GSBA needed greater oversight. This was accomplished on April 15, 2014. We are honored by the kind words of Ken Bishop, President and CEO of NASBA that "The Georgia State Board of Accountancy is now among the strongest in the country and the relationship between the Board and society is stronger than ever."


